PRESENTATION OF THE **CARIBBEAN MEDICAL AND PEDIATRICIAN COOPERATION PROGRAM**, IMPLEMENTED BY ESA-CARAÏBES:

This two-years program aims to set up a coordination of specialized pediatric care and trainings for health professionals in the Caribbean.

It includes the three following components: training; specialized consultations in specific areas such as pediatric cardiology and neurology; and hospitalization in Martinique for specific pathologies that can not be treated in the concerned countries.


Countries concerned with the project: Martinique, Haiti, Dominica, St Lucia, Grenada, St Vincent

Beneficiaries: (total beneficiaries for 24 months duration)


- Caribbean children carrying very specific pathologies (such as cardiac, neurological, cancer, and neonatal) from different islands in the Caribbean, including Haiti: **more than 200 children for specialized consultations; 40 children for hospital care in Martinique.**

- More than **250 child health professionals** throughout the Caribbean region, including Haiti, for training sessions in specific areas such as cardiology, neurology and neonatology.

The program engages additional partnerships whenever needed or indicated with other French and US NGO's .

We also have grand-children and we were pleased to receive Hollison, to take care of him during its stay. We will now keep in touch. »







THE STAY
